Greetings to everyone involved with the ACRE Project - it's been a while!

It's also a good time to get in touch with an update on ACRE. The resounding success of the project has led to ongoing funding to roll out ACRE Stage II. This involves implementation of the ImpACT (Improved Assessment of Chest pain Trial) protocol, derived from the latest round of research conducted by the team led by Louise Cullen and Will Parsonage.

About the ImpACT Pathway:

ImpACT takes a different approach to ADAPT and allows up to 60% of possible cardiac chest pain patients to safely undergo accelerated care. It focuses on identifying a group of very low risk patients who can be discharged without further testing, and identifying a larger group of intermediate risk patients who can undergo early testing prior to discharge.

Where ImpACT is at:

The protocol remained standard practice at the RBWH in 2014 following the research and has more recently been introduced as a pilot study at Cairns Hospital in collaboration with the ACRE Team. Ipswich Hospital is planning to introduce the protocol this month.

In time we will be approaching all ACRE sites that may be suitable for ImpACT. Please feel free to contact our team if you have any questions.

ACRE Branches into Research

The ACRE Project has been awarded an AusHSI Partnership Grant to investigate the applicability of the ImpACT protocol to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients. This research project will be undertaken in collaboration with clinicians and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander representatives in Cairns, and is

currently pending ethics approval. The aim is to clarify whether Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients should undergo modified risk stratification for suspected ACS.

To our knowledge this question has never been researched and we are hoping this project will answer some questions and hopefully lead to more research in this crucial area.
